

## If you are leaving Winterthur, please remember to deregister with the Residents' Registration Office within 14 days.

You can report your departure in the following ways:

- Online via <a href="mailto:eUmzugCH">eUmzugCH</a> (not valid for weekly residents)
- By phone
- In person at the Residents' Registration Office counter
  - Passport or identity card (original document) is required
  - Residence permit (original document) is also required for foreign nationals

## **Moving abroad**

If you are relocating abroad, you must first deregister in person with the **Tax Office**, and then with the **Residents' Registration Office**.

Deregistration can be done **no earlier than three months before your departure**.

Once you have deregistered, the Residents' Registration Office will gladly issue you a **confirmation of deregistration** – for example, for insurance companies, health insurers, customs, or other authorities.

## **Reporting minors**

A move (to, from, or within Winterthur) involving children under the age of 18 may only be reported by a **legal guardian**.

If the parents live at different addresses, a **completed declaration** must be submitted to the Residents' Registration Office.

Court rulings or KESB (Child and Adult Protection Authority)
decisions regarding custody must be presented upon request.

**Important**: In the case of a **move abroad**, the **signature of both legal guardians** on the declaration is mandatory.
